CRIMINAL
COMPLAINT AND INFORMATION

IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE MUSCOGEE (CREEK) NATION comes now Matthew J. Hall, the duly qualified Prosecutor, within and for the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, and upon their oath of office gives the District Court of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, to know and be informed and complain that defendant **Robyn Whitecloud**, an Indian person, did, within the jurisdiction of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, on or about the 2nd day of January, 2026, anterior to the presentment hereof, commit the following crime(s) in the manner and form as follows:

COUNT ONE: PREVENT OR ATTEMPT TO PREVENT PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL ACTS (MCNCA Title 14, § 2-803) That said Defendant within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation on the day and year aforesaid did willfully, either by force, physical interference, fraud, intimidation, threats of violence or by means of any independently unlawful act, prevents or attempts to prevent any Tribal official, member of a Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, employee of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and/or employee of Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation from performing any official act, function, power or duty imposed upon such individual by law, to-wit: Representative Whitecloud did enter into the office of National Council, and with the aid of another, did remove correspondence belonging to Representative Galen Cloud, without their consent, and did thereby prevent said Representative from performing their sworn duties by depriving them of their official correspondence.

This crime is a felony punishable by imprisonment for up to three (3) years and/or a fine of not more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).

COUNT TWO: PREVENT OR ATTEMPT TO PREVENT PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL ACTS (MCNCA Title 14, § 2-803) That said Defendant within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation on the day and year aforesaid did willfully, either by force, physical

interference, fraud, intimidation, threats of violence or by means of any independently unlawful act, prevents or attempts to prevent any Tribal official, member of a Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, employee of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and/or employee of Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation from performing any official act, function, power or duty imposed upon such individual by law, to-wit: Representative Whitecloud did enter into the office of National Council, and with the aid of another, did remove correspondence belonging to Representative Anna Marshall, without their consent, and did thereby prevent said Representative from performing their sworn duties by depriving them of their official correspondence.

This crime is a felony punishable by imprisonment for up to three (3) years and/or a fine of not more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).


COUNT THREE: PREVENT OR ATTEMPT TO PREVENT PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL ACTS (MCNCA Title 14, § 2-803) That said Defendant within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation on the day and year aforesaid did willfully, either by force, physical interference, fraud, intimidation, threats of violence or by means of any independently unlawful act, prevents or attempts to prevent any Tribal official, member of a Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, employee of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and/or employee of Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation from performing any official act, function, power or duty imposed upon such individual by law, to-wit: Representative Whitecloud did enter into the office of National Council, and with the aid of another, did remove correspondence belonging to Representative-Elect Lucian Tiger, without their consent, and did thereby prevent said Representative from performing their sworn duties by depriving them of their official correspondence.

This crime is a felony punishable by imprisonment for up to three (3) years and/or a fine of not more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).

COUNT FOUR: PREVENT OR ATTEMPT TO PREVENT PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL ACTS (MCNCA Title 14, § 2-803) That said Defendant within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation on the day and year aforesaid did willfully, either by force, physical interference, fraud, intimidation, threats of violence or by means of any independently unlawful act, prevents or attempts to prevent any Tribal official, member of a Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, employee of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and/or employee of Board of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation from performing any official act, function, power or duty imposed upon such individual by law, to-wit: Representative Whitecloud did enter into the office of National Council, and with the aid of another, did remove correspondence belonging to Representative-Elect William Lowe, without their consent, and did thereby prevent said Representative from performing their sworn duties by depriving them of their official correspondence.

This crime is a felony punishable by imprisonment for up to three (3) years and/or a fine of not more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).

Contrary to the form of the laws in such case made and against the peace and dignity of the Nation.

PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVIT

The undersigned upon oath deposes and states as follows, to-wit:

I

I, Anthony Thompson, hereby state there is reasonable and probable cause to believe that **Robyn Whitecloud** during the timeframe of an leading up to **01/02/2026** in the boundaries of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, did commit the offense of **COUNT 1: Prevent or Attempt to Prevent Official Acts a Felony violation of Title 14, Chapter 2, Section 803.**

II

Your affiant is an Investigator with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Lighthorse Police Department. I have met all statutory standards and requirements for education to serve as a peace officer in Indian Country and in the State of Oklahoma. I have completed official investigative reviews and collected documents regarding the above-named Defendant, and from these reviews and documents, it appears as follows:

III

Your affiant knows, on January 2, 2026, he received a complaint from Muscogee (Creek) Nation Council Representative-elect Lucian Tiger III regarding the unauthorized removal of official correspondence addressed to him and other members of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation National Council.

The correspondence consisted of sealed envelopes addressed to multiple Council Representatives and Representatives-elect and related to official National Council business. These communications were intended to be delivered to elected officials in order for them to review, consider, and act upon matters within their official capacities.

Representative-elect Tiger reported that his correspondence was removed from the designated outbox of Julie Sharp(Scott), who is responsible for the handling and distribution of National Council correspondence. The removal was not authorized. Tiger

identified Council Representative Robyn Whitecloud as the individual who removed the correspondence, acting individually and/or in concert with another.

The removal of the correspondence delayed and interfered with the timely receipt of official communications, thereby preventing or attempting to prevent Council Representatives and Representatives-elect from performing official acts.

Additional complaints were received from Representative-elect William Lowe and Council Representative Galen Cloud, both of which were consistent with the initial report.

Your affiant obtained and reviewed surveillance video. The video was consistent with witness statements and depicted conduct consistent with the unauthorized removal of correspondence.

Julie Sharp advised that she is the primary individual responsible for the distribution of Council correspondence and that it is rare for any other individual to remove correspondence from the outbox.

Following the National Council Inauguration on January 3, 2026, Representative Robyn Whitecloud returned sixteen (16) envelopes consistent with the correspondence previously reported missing. These envelopes were turned over to Speaker Randall Hicks, who then transferred them to the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Lighthorse Police.

The correspondence belonged to the following Council Representatives and Representatives-elect:


Charles McHenry; Darrell Proctor; Thomasene Yahola-Osborne; Anna Marshall; Nelson Harjo Sr.; Dode Barnett; Galen Cloud; Robert Huff; Leonard Gouge; Joyce Deere; Patrick Freeman Jr.; Mary Tiger; Lucian Tiger III; Lora Harjo-King; William Lowe; and James Factor.

Robyn Whitecloud is an enrolled member of the Muscogee Nation, a federally recognized tribe and has some degree of Indian blood.

IV

Based on the totality of the circumstances, I believe there is probable cause to believe that Robyn Whitecloud knowingly prevented or attempted to prevent the performance of official acts by Muscogee (Creek) Nation Council Representatives and Representatives-elect, in violation of Muscogee (Creek) Nation Code Title 14, Chapter 2, Section 803, a Felony.
